Sanctuary Night opens new dropin center on Sullivant Avenue for human trafficking victims

With the goal of one day becoming the first 24/7 drop-in center in Franklin County for women on the streets, Sanctuary Night has made its long awaited move to its own building on Sullivant Avenue.

IN 2022, WE OPENED OUR DOORS!


There is no doubt that the highlight of 2022 for our organization was being able to open wide the doors of 1195 Sullivant Avenue! We were delighted to see so many of our supporters at our ribbon-cutting event on a gorgeous day in May. After 5 years+ of operating at Lower Lights Ministries between 2-10 hours per week, we were able to pivot into our very own space and begin dreaming about becoming a 24/7 facility!

The statistic that stands out to us the most from 2022 is that while we anticipated serving 150 unique womxn in our first *year* of operating, by the end of 2022, after only 8 months of operating, we had served 518 unique womxn. (See page 3 for more statistics).

Other highlights for the year included:

- Being named one of the **5 NonProfits to Watch** for 2022 by The Columbus Foundation. (March)
- Hiring two more survivors to our staff in the fall of 2022. (September & October), bringing us to a total of 8 folks on staff with lived experience.
- Introducing Sanctuary Night alum Angel Summers at her CATCH Court Graduation, making her the first graduate to enter CATCH Court without the traumatizing experience of going to jail! (September)
- Launching our Southside pilot In collaboration with Community Development for All People. (November)
- 3 baby showers hosted at 1195 Sullivant Avenue, and 3 healthy babies delivered! (June, November, December)
 A long-time guest of Sanctuary Night who decided to get sober the day we opened our building. Eventually, she decided to go to our beloved partner, Lower Lights Ministries, for long-term treatment. With almost a year sober, she has begun to inquire about a job with us!
- An ongoing partnership with the Wexner Center for the Arts, who brings vetted and trained artists into our space to make it more beautiful and to provide art programming for our guests!


Nothing about us without us.

From our organization's inception, we have committed to following the leadership of those with lived experience. Survivors of the sex trade have served on our Advisory Panel (2017-2019), our Survivor Leader Advisory Panel (2020-2021), and held two seats on our Board of Directors (2019-present). By the end of 2022, 8/13 of our employees identify as those with lived experience.

Our dream is that at some point in the future, we will be 100% survivor-run. So, we're not just offering direct service jobs to survivors, though they have so much to offer as peer support specialists and clinical case managers. Two of the eight survivors moved Into operational positions - Operations Manager and Office Manager.






